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## Baringa School Student Dress Code

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Baringa Schools requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Baringa School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Baringa School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

### **SCOPE**

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

### UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

The full list of Example School's compulsory school uniform items are available at Appendix A to this policy.

### **General appearance**

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms should be kept as clean as possible
- Uniforms should be clearly marked with the owner's name

- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden
- Coats (of any form) may be worn in term 3 when engaging in outdoor activities or at recess and lunch break times.
- Studs, sleepers and watches are the only acceptable jewellery

### **Health and safety**

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of lice and for student safety.

Jewellery, nails, hair accessories and similar items that interfere with students' ability to engage with school activities safely and fully are not permitted.

School uniform hats must be worn outside from August 31<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup> and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

### **PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS**

Uniform items can be purchased second hand from the school administration office, or parents may order it directly from Beleza.

The School Council has considered affordability in the development of this dress code. However, if you are facing difficulty meeting uniform costs the <u>Help with school costs and fees</u> page provides advice on support offered by the Victorian Government. If your child is starting prep or year 7 and is eligible to receive support via the <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u>, you may be eligible to access the Affordable School Uniform (ASU) program.

Please contact Tania Del Busso (Wellbeing Officer) to discuss support that we may be able to provide.

### **IMPLEMENTATION**

Baringa School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and Facebook page. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a phone call will be provided to the and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

Measures taken by Baringa School to address concerns about student non-compliance with the Student Dress Code will also be addressed in accordance with our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

### **EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE**

We acknowledge that there might be instances where the enforcement of this dress code could impact students differently.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

### CONCERNS ABOUT THIS STUDENT DRESS CODE

### **APPENDIX A: BARINGA SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS**

### All year round

The following items may be worn all year round, with either the summer or winter uniform:

### **Jumper OR Vest**

Navy super fleece hoodie with or without school logo

Navy polar/vest fleece with or without school logo

### **Polo shirts**

Navy long and short sleeve polo pique top with or without school logo.

### **Pants**

Plain, navy blue track pants without decoration or brand name

### Socks or tights/stockings

Navy blue or white socks Navy blue tights/stockings

### **Footwear**

Appropriate footwear is to be worn. Black school shoes or pull-on school boots or runners (of any colour) are permitted. No thongs or open-toed sandals are permitted.

### Coat

A coat of any colour may be worn for any outdoor activities and breaktimes in term 3.

### Summer Uniform – to be worn in Terms 1 and 4

### **Dresses**

Summer blue and white checked dress

### **Shorts**

Plain navy blue shorts without decoration or brand name

### Hats – to be worn from mid-August to 30 April

Broadbrim or cap (of any colour). Beanies are not accepted.
