Alpacas originate from South America and are also used for farming, transport and provide fibre for garments.

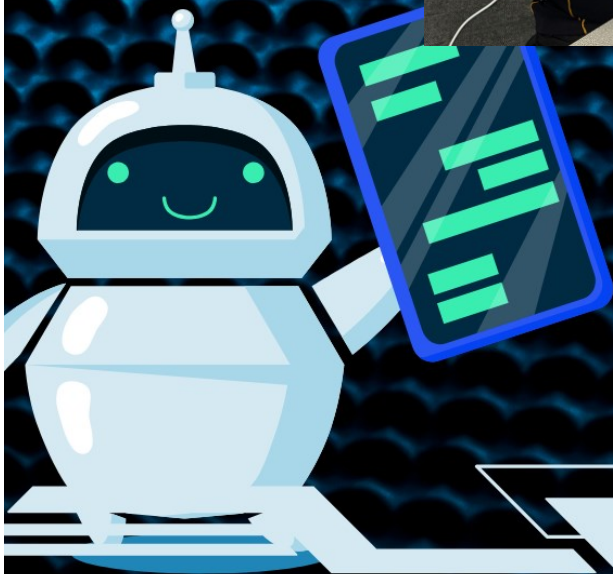
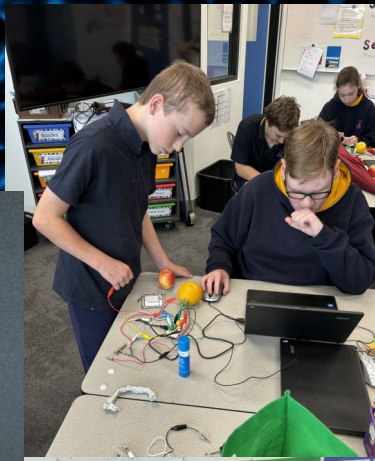
Students made fabric painted Alpaca pillows and learnt how to make pom poms and garlands to decorate them .

This year in Robotics students have shown their creative side. They have had the opportunity to make cool creations out of Lego and design some amazing things for the 3D printer.



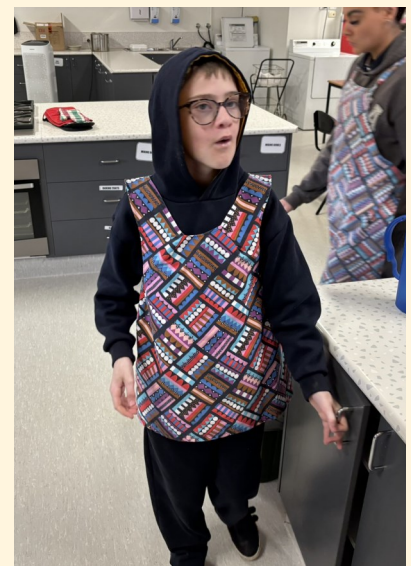
CHILDERS PROGRAM

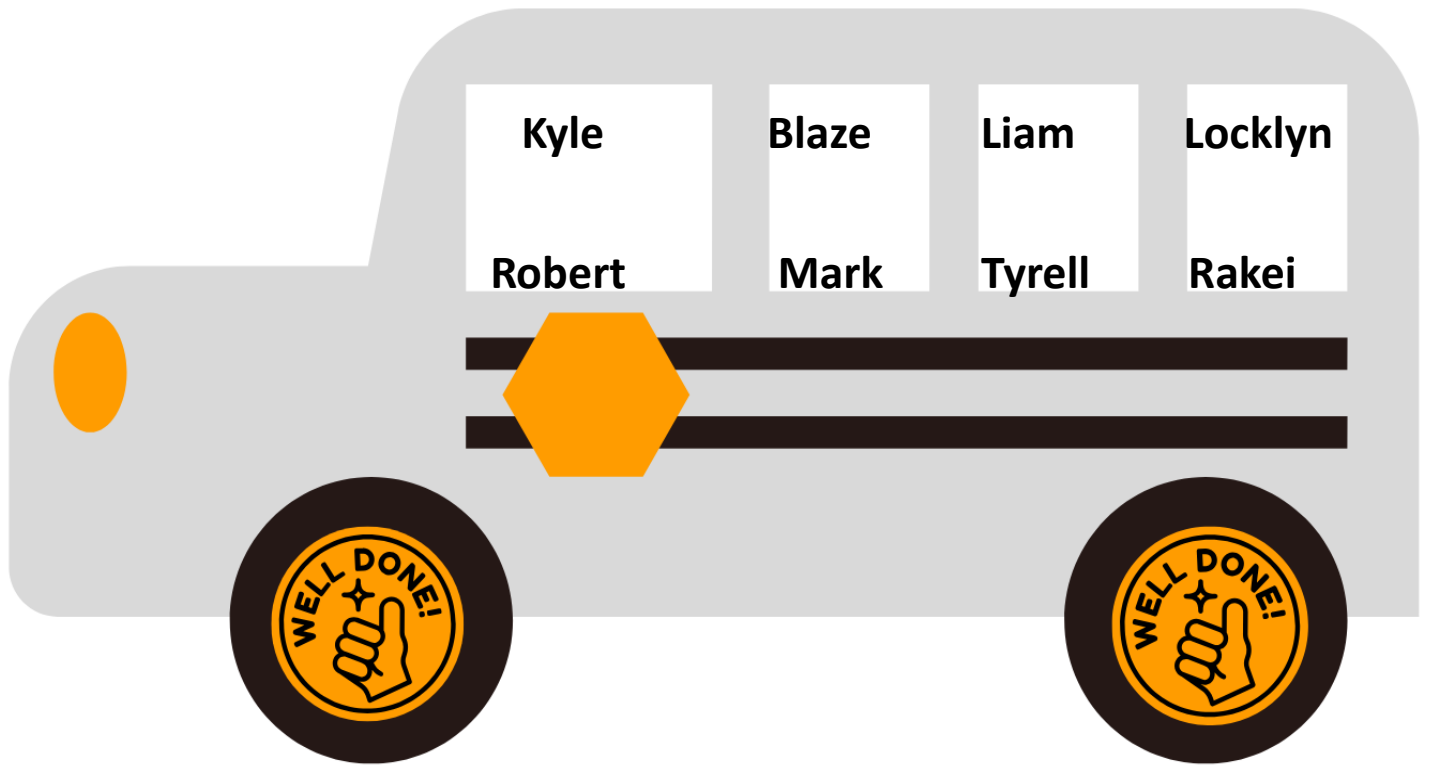


Around The World
